How to Register Online:

1. Log on to www.kissimmeeparks.org and click on the link entitled "Register Online". Enter your Username and Password.

- If you have registered for our programs before but, have never registered online, your Username is your 10-digit phone number and your Password is your Zip code.
- If you are a first-time user, create an account by clicking "Need Help" and then "Need An Account"
- To browse programs without signing in, click on "Guest" option

2. Select a Program

- Browse programs by Category (Pre-school, Youth, Adult, Senior) and/or by Type (Sports, Dance, Music, etc.)
- Search by Keyword (ex. "Tennis") or
- Enter the Activity Number of a specific program listed in the Program, Events and Facility Guide

3. Register

- Click on the shopping cart icon to the left of the program
- Select the Family Member to enroll
- Click on the "Add to Cart" button

4. Checkout

- Click on the "Checkout" button and enter the Visa or Master Card information
- Review the billing information and click on the "Go" button. Please be patient! Selecting "Go" more than once, may result in the credit card being charged multiple times.

ENROLLMENT POLICY

Every program session has a minimum and maximum enrollment to ensure a quality experience. The best way to check availability and confirm enrollment is to register on-line at www.kissimmeeparks.org or by phone/in person at the pertinent facility.

INSURANCE / WAIVER & RELEASE FORMS

There is an inherent risk when participating in certain recreational activities and the Parks & Recreation Department does not carry medical accident insurance for injuries or illnesses sustained during its programs. Prior to participation, all persons must sign a waiver and release form and online registrants will also be required to agree to "terms" as part of the check out process. The absence of personal medical insurance coverage does not make the City of Kissimmee responsible for payment of a participant's medical expenses.

PROGRAM CANCELLATIONS

Activity fees must be paid in full at the time of program registration. The Parks & Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel or combine programs and/or change the time, date, instructor, or location of a program or activity, if necessary. In the event your program is changed or cancelled, you will be notified and will be issued a complete refund if you do not find a comparable program.

PROGRAM REFUNDS

If you choose to cancel your registration, a refund will be issued based on the following scale:

- 100% refund on or before first day/week of class
- 75% refund on or before second day/week of class
- 0% refund after second day/week of class*

*After the second day/week of class, a doctor's note will be required to be issued a prorated refund.

LATE FEE POLICY

All programs and/or camps may be subject to late fees as determined by the Parks & Recreation Department or program instructors.





LEARN TO SWIM CLASSES - MERMAID AQUATICS

PARENT - CHILD CLASSES

LEVEL 1/2: AGES 6 MONTHS - 3 YEARS

The foundation of the Red Cross Parent and Child Aquatics is a set of basic skills that help prepare infants and young children to become comfortable in the water so they are willing and ready to learn to swim. In addition to orienting young children to the water, Parent and Child Aquatics provides parents with information and techniques to create safer aquatic experiences for their children.

PRESCHOOL CLASSES

LEVEL 1, 2 & 3: AGES 4 - 5 YEARS

Preschool Aquatics Level 1 is designed to orient young preschoolers to the aquatic environment and to help them gain basic aquatic skills. In addition participants start learning how to be safe around water. Preschool 2 builds on the basic aquatic skills and water safety skills and concepts learned in level 1. Participants begin to perform skills at a slightly more advanced level and begin gaining rudimentary propulsive skill on both the front and the back. This marks the beginning of independent aquatic locomotion skills. Preschool 3 builds on the skills learned in level 1 and 2. Participants are able to perform basic aquatic skills with greater proficiency, for longer distances and times. In addition, previously acquired water safety knowledge and skills are enforced and expanded upon.

YOUTH CLASSES

LEVEL 1: INTRO TO WATER SKILLS (AGES 6 AND UP)

Level 1 introduces basic aquatic skills, which participants continue to build as they progress through Learn-to-Swim. In addition, start developing positive attitudes, effective swimming habits and safe practices in and around the water.

LEVEL 2: FUNDAMENTAL AQUATIC SKILLS (AGES 6 AND UP)

Objective is to give participants success with fundamental skills. This level marks the beginning of true locomotive skills. Participants are taught to glide and float without support and recover to a vertical position. Participants further develop simultaneous and alternating arm and leg actions on the front and back, laying the foundation for future strokes. New water safety topics are introduced and previously acquired water safety knowledge and skills are reinforced.

LEVEL 3: STROKE DEVELOPMENT (AGES 6 AND UP)

The objectives are to expand proficiency of previously learned skills by providing additional guided practice. Participants are taught and practice survival floating and learn to swim front crawl and elementary backstroke at rudimentary proficiency levels. You introduce the scissors and dolphin kicks and extend the time duration for treading water. Participants also learn rules for headfirst entries and begin to learn to enter the water headfirst from a seated position at poolside (in 9 feet of water). As in all levels, new and previously addressed water safety topics are included. Participants who successfully complete Level 3 have achieved basic water competency in a pool environment.

LEVEL 4: STROKE IMPROVEMENT (AGES 6 AND UP)

Participants improve their aquatic skills and increase their endurance by swimming the strokes learned in Level 3 for greater distances and with more advanced proficiency. Participants add arm actions to the previously learned scissors kick and breaststroke kick to perform the rudimentary sidestroke and to learn the breaststroke. Participants also begin to learn the back crawl and butterfly, as well as the basics of performing a simple open turn at the wall.

LEVEL 5: STROKE REFINEMENT (AGES 6 AND UP)

Participants refine their performance of all six strokes (front crawl, back crawl, sidestroke, elementary backstroke, butterfly and breaststroke) and increase the distance that they swim. Participants also are taught to perform flip turns on the front and back.

LEVEL 6: ADVANCED CLASSES (AGES 6 AND UP)

The objective of this level is to refine strokes so participants swim them with greater efficiency and effectiveness over longer distances. Level 6 offers three options to meet specific needs and interests - Personal Water Safety, Fundamentals of Diving and Fitness Swimmer. These options preparing participants for more advanced courses such as Water Safety Instructor or activities such as competitive swimming or diving. Because of the variety this level offers, participants can repeat it to focus on different goals each time.

BASIC SNORKELING (AGES 6 AND UP)

The objective of this class is to develop confidence using a mask, fins, and snorkel. Participants need to have completed Level 3 or higher to be enrolled in the class. Participants are taught how to select appropriate equipment, clear a mask and snorkel under water, learn 3 basic kicks using fins, and how to perform surface dives. Class is designed to help participants interested in snorkeling in open bodies of water or those participants interested in scuba diving.

ADULT LESSONS -18 YEARS AND OLDER

Adult swim courses are intended for older teens and adults wishing to improve their knowledge of, and skill in, the water. Adult swim offers three option to meet specific needs and interests - learning the basics, improving skills and swimming strokes and swimming for fitness.

JUNIOR LIFEGUARD

The Mermaid Aquatics Junior Lifeguard Program is designed for youth ages 9-17. The program has a strong focus on developing swimming skills to help participants meet the lifeguard course prerequisites. Students gain a wide variety of skills and knowledge including how to enjoy the water safely, first aid and CPR, lifesaving rescue techniques, the importance of keeping physically fit and other topics related to lifeguarding while having an opportunity to learn from professional lifeguards. This valuable experience builds self-confidence and skill for life.

Prerequisite: Must demonstrate proficiency with freestyle and breaststroke. Candidate will swim 25 yards of each stroke, tread water for 30 seconds, and float on back 30 seconds.



